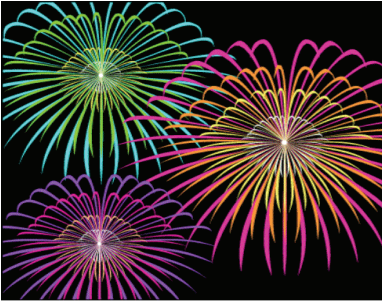

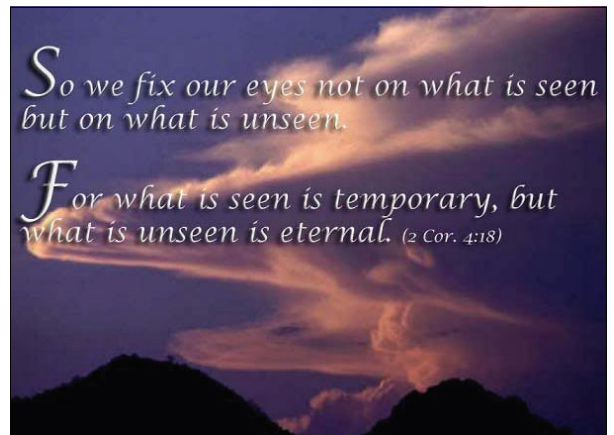
each one to strengthen and prepare you for future blessings. SO BE ENCOURAGED!

The apostle's writings from prison reveal personal heartaches, failure, and physical agony. The pain that Paul suffered went to the core of his being. In his darkest hour, his faith was stretched beyond what many of us could bear.

Yet despite continuous setbacks, Paul was convinced that God would see him through that turmoil to greater end. This is why he wrote, "Not that I have already obtained it or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:12).

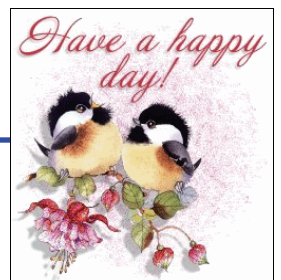

It was a privilege to teach our precious children this December, especially introducing some of them to our Savior, Baby Jesus. We had many important lessons this month such as letters, numbers, and colors, but the most important lesson of all is “The Christmas Nativity Story”.
